

# Village of Fairport Refuse Rules and Regulations

## 1. Refuse Schedule

- 1.1. Residential and commercial refuse will be picked up on a weekly schedule.
- 1.2. Bulk refuse will be picked up on a weekly schedule dependent on weather and Department operations.

## 2. Refuse Containers

### 2.1. Standard refuse container

- 2.1.1. A container for the storage of refuse shall be moisture proof and made of plastic material or galvanized and shall be of substantial construction, with a top.
- 2.1.2. Containers shall have two handles.
- 2.1.3. Containers must be designed for the storage of refuse. No homemade containers will be collected.
- 2.1.4. Cardboard boxes, paper barrels, paper bags, or recycling bins are not suitable substitutes for standard refuse containers and will not be collected.
- 2.1.5. Containers shall have a capacity of not less than 18 gallons nor more than 32 gallons.
- 2.1.6. Containers shall not exceed 50 pounds in weight.
- 2.1.7. Plastic bags shall be a minimum of 4 millimeters or more in thickness and shall not exceed 20 pounds in weight.
- 2.1.8. The Village shall assume no liability for any damages to said containers resulting from handling during collection.

### 2.2. Rolling refuse container

- 2.2.1. A moisture proof container for the storage of refuse shall be of plastic material equipped with wheels, lift bracket, and a lid and designed for mechanical dumping.
- 2.2.2. Rolling refuse containers must meet Village specifications to be dumped.
- 2.2.3. Rolling refuse containers may not exceed 96 gallons in capacity.
- 2.2.4. Rolling refuse containers shall not exceed 150 pounds in weight.
- 2.2.5. All refuse in rolling refuse containers must be bagged in the event an automatic tipper is not available.
- 2.2.6. The Village shall assume no liability for any damages to said containers resulting from handling during collection.

### 2.3. Dumpsters

- 2.3.1. Dumpsters shall be of metal construction, moisture proof, leak free, and in good physical condition with tops capable of being secured in an open position when dumping.
- 2.3.2. Dumpsters shall be of rear loading design and meet all Department specifications for collection by Department equipment.

- 2.3.3. Dumpsters shall not exceed 10 yards in capacity or exceed weight capacity of Department equipment.
- 2.3.4. Dumpster enclosures shall meet Department specifications and any gates shall be capable of being secured in an open position
- 2.3.5. The Village shall assume no liability for any damages to said dumpsters or enclosures resulting from handling during collection.

### 3. Bulk Refuse

- 3.1. Bulk refuse is any item eligible for collection that is either too heavy or too large to be placed in a standard refuse container.
- 3.2. Bulk refuse will be picked up the same as refuse dependent on weather and Department operations.
- 3.3. Bulk refuse is limited to one bulk refuse pile, 8ft. long, 4ft. wide, and 4ft. high, per week.
- 3.4. Bulk refuse shall be placed neatly between the sidewalk and the curb, parallel to the street and free from any obstructions.
- 3.5. Bulk refuse materials of different types shall be separated by type and not exceed the maximum size for a bulk refuse pile.
- 3.6. No contractor generated debris of any type be collected

### 4. Unacceptable Refuse

- 4.1. Unacceptable refuse is any material the Village designates as not eligible for refuse collection that is hazardous, infectious, recyclable, or unable to be disposed of.
- 4.2. Unactable refuse items are listed in the Village of Fairport Refuse Items.
- 4.3. Any type of contractor debris will not be collected.
- 4.4. The Department shall have the final determination of acceptability on any unlisted items

### 5. Preparation For Collection

- 5.1. Residential Refuse
  - 5.1.1. All residential refuse shall be shielded from view except when out for collection.
  - 5.1.2. No refuse, including recyclables, shall be placed between the sidewalk and the curb for collection prior to 6:00 PM the day prior to the scheduled collection.
  - 5.1.3. All refuse containers shall be removed from between the sidewalk and curb within 24 hours of collection.
  - 5.1.4. All residential refuse for pickup shall be placed in one location free from obstructions.

# Village of Fairport Refuse Items

Listed below are common refuse items and if the Village of Fairport collects them. Each item is listed along with if they are acceptable for refuse collection and a code for how they must be disposed of. If you do not see an item listed please call the Department of Public Works at 223-9500 to see if that item is eligible for refuse collection.

All household refuse and bulk refuse must be neatly placed at the curb between the street and the sidewalk and free from any obstructions. No refuse items may be placed out for pick up prior to 6:00 PM the day prior to collection and all empty cans should be removed within 24 hours of refuse collection.

Code	Refuse Disposal R
AP1	Must be placed between the sidewalk and curb separate from other items. No central or commercial units will be accepted.
AP2	Must be placed between the sidewalk and curb separate from other items with doors and racks removed and water drained. No commercial units will be accepted.
AP3	Must be placed between the sidewalk and curb separate from other items with doors and racks removed. No commercial units will be accepted.
AP4	Must be placed between the sidewalk and curb separate from other items. May not exceed 6 feet in length in any direction. No commercial units will be accepted.

<b>Code</b>	<b>Refuse Disposal R</b>
BR1	Placed between the sidewalk and curb, piled neatly in one direction parallel to the curb and not placed near any obstructions. No single piece of bush to exceed 8 feet in length, 12 inches in diameter, or 50 pounds in weight.
BR2	Stumps greater than 12 inches in diameter will not be collected.
BR3	Fuel tanks and barrels must be cut in half and free of any liquids or sludge to be collected.
BR4	These items may be placed in the bulk trash pile.
BR5	Gas grills will be accepted for collection providing the gas tank has been removed along with all grates and charcoal.
BR6	Items will be collected provided they have been drained of all fluids and batteries removed. Items shall be piled separately for recycling
BR7	No single item may exceed 6 ft. in length or 50 lbs. in weight. Any concrete must be removed from the items and disposed of separately. Items should be separate from other items for recycling.
BR8	Bulk Refuse Pile. Neatly piled parallel to the curb. No item to exceed 6 feet in length, 4 ft. in width or 50 lbs. in weight. Nails must be removed or bent down.
BR9	Construction Debris. Must be placed in containers not to exceed 50 pounds or a maximum of 12 cans in combination with other refuse. No bulk piles or contractor generated debris will be collected.
BR10	No single item to exceed 4 ft. in length or 50 lbs. in weight
BR11	Bulk Refuse Pile. Must be placed in sealed plastic bags not to exceed 20 pounds in weight or a maximum of 12 cans or bags in combination with other refuse. No bulk piles will be collected.
BR12	Bulk Refuse Pile. Neatly piled parallel to the curb separate from other items. No item to exceed 6 feet in length, 50 lbs. in weight.
EW1	Electronic Waste. The Village does not collect. Must be recycled through an electronic waste recycling center.
HW1	Hazardous waste. The Village does not collect. Must be disposed of through a hazardous waste facility.
HW2	Hazardous waste. The Village does not collect. Must be disposed of through a hazardous waste facility or contact the Fairport Police Department to schedule drop off.
RW1	Recyclable waste. The Village does not collect. Must be recycled.
SP1	Propane tanks will collected if empty
SP2	Latex paint cans less than 1/2 full off paint will be collected if the paint is dried up through the use of an absorbent and the lids are off. Please pile separately.
SP3	Small amounts of animal waste will be collected with normal refuse.
SP4	Dead animals will not be collected.
UW1	Unacceptable Waste. The Village does not collect.
YW1	Yard Waste. Must be placed in containers not to exceed 50 pounds in weight or a maximum of 12 cans in combination with other refuse. Large piles greater, than six containers, may be piled between the sidewalk and the curb for bulk pick up. No small loose piles will be collected.
YW2	Bulk leaves will be collected between October 1st through December weather permitting. Bulk Leaf pick up may be suspended for the year upon the first significant snowfall. Leaves must be placed in containers the remainder of the year. Leaves shall be piled between the sidewalk and the curb in one pile parallel to the street. Leaves shall not be piled around obstructions and must be reachable from the street by Department equipment. Leaves shall be free of other yard debris including, grass clippings, sticks, rocks etc. g. Small piles of leaves, less than three containers, shall be placed in containers. No small piles will be collected.
